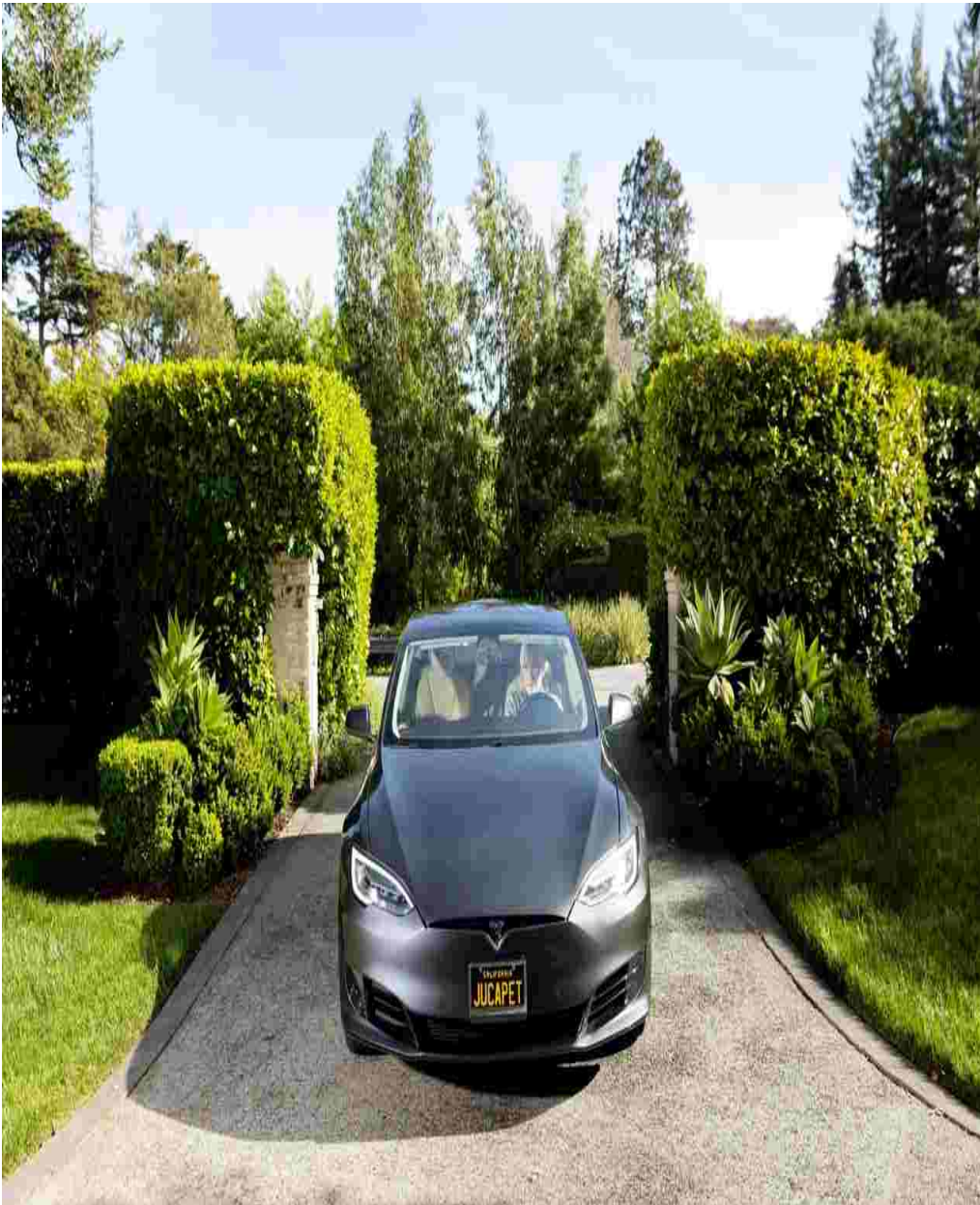


Car Owners Are Revolting Over Tesla's Self-Driving Promises

An international backlash is growing over outdated Tesla hardware

When Tom LoSavio bought his [Tesla](#) TSLA 3.01% Model S in 2017, he thought he was buying a car that would one day drive itself. The retired attorney and self-described early adopter paid more than \$100,000 for the luxury sedan, including \$8,000 for lifetime access to its most advanced driver-assistance features. Tesla Chief Executive Elon Musk said that the hardware in the company's cars would eventually allow all of its cars to drive themselves.

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
